Robert M. "Bob" Hawes has created a fascinating exhibit sponsored by the Daytona Beach members of Chapter 189, Korean War Veterans Association, Florida Department of State.

June 14, 2016 ~ November 12, 2016.

June 25, 1950, backed by Russia and China, some 75,000 soldiers from the North Korean People's Army poured across the 38th parallel into the Western Republic of Korea in the South. This invasion became the first military action of the Cold War. Harry S. Truman was President of the United States. American troops entered the war on South Korea's behalf in a war against international communism. The facts and photos of this war will surprise and even shock you. Some 5 million soldiers and civilians lost their lives during this war and the Korean peninsula is still divided today. As you will see in this exhibit, the Halifax Country citizens who participated in this war have truly made it part of our history. Don't miss. . . .
