Parkinson's group looks at apathy, depression

People with Parkinson's disease commonly lose interest in things they used to like to do. But is this caused by depression or apathy?

Clinical neuropsychologist Dawn Powers, Ph.D., will explain the differences between the two symptoms from 2 to 3:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 22, at the Daytona Beach Regional Library at City Island, 105 E. Magnolia Ave., Daytona Beach.

Dr. Bowers is a professor of neuropsychology at the University of Florida Health Center for Movement Disorders and Neurorestoration. She is also director of the Cognitive Neuroscience Laboratory at the university's McKnight Brain Institute.
