Dr. Jason Aufdenberg, Associate Professor of Physics and Astronomy at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, is also a member of the River-to-Sea Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee. His presentation will focus on cargo bikes, route planning, and the building of a better bicycle infrastructure; his observations are based on almost a decade of using the bicycle as a primary mode of transportation in the Daytona Beach area.

The River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization is an independent group that identifies projects programmed over a five year period that are funded with state and federal transportation dollars and are located within the River to Sea TPO's planning area. This includes all of Volusia County and areas within Flagler County that are set to be urbanized. Member local governments and citizens are able to voice concerns, identify priorities, and plan for transportation improvements for all modes of transportation, including bicycling.

This free sustainable living program is open to the public and is sponsored by The Friends of the Daytona Beach Library. The program will take place on Saturday, March 28, 2015, starting at 2:00 pm.
